Seaboard Marine

Update September 13th - All container that were at a customer location shall have free time extended for the duration of our PortMiami terminal closure, September 8 through September 11. Free time calculation resumed on Tuesday, September 12. Container that moved under Carrier Haulage shall not be subject to detention charges so long as the customer has registered available pick-up through Seaboard Marine's website or confirmed a pick-up number through Customer Service on or before September 12.

Yangming Marine Transport

Update September 13th - Demurrage Free Time: Per Terminal announcement. If containers were in demurrage prior, Yang Ming will not extend additional days.

Per Diem:

Jacksonville, FL – 9/8, 9/11, 9/12 are listed as non-working days, excluded from per diem clock.

Miami, FL – 9/8 is listed as non-working day, excluded from per diem clock.

Savannah, GA – 9/11, 9/12 are listed as non-working days, excluded from per diem clock.

Charleston, SC – 9/11 is listed as non-working day, excluded from per diem clock.

Ports

Jacksonville Port Authority

Update September 12th – Jaxport gates and terminals are now open. The Port of Jacksonville is now open to shallow water vessels 500 gross tons or less. All other vessels are prohibited unless specially authorized by the Captain of the Port.

Update September 9th – Jaxport offices will remain closed through Tuesday, September 13. All non-mission essential personnel are to return to work at their regularly scheduled time on Wednesday, September 13th.

Update September 8th - All Jaxport terminals closed as of 11:59 p.m. on Friday, September 8th. The Coast Guard closed the Port of Jacksonville at 8:00 p.m. Saturday, September 9th.

Port of Tampa Bay

Update September 13th – Port re-opened on Tuesday, September 12th

Update September 9th – The Coast Guard shut down Port Tampa Bay, Port Manatee and Port St. Pete ahead of Hurricane Irma on Saturday, Sept. 9th. Ports are now closed to all vessel traffic and operations have been shut down.

Pomtoc – Pomtoc terminal gates closed on Thursday, September 7th in anticipation of Hurricane Irma. Re-opening information will be communicated with PortMiami and will be posted on the POMTO and Forecast websites.

Update September 13th – Pomtoc terminal gates will re-open Wednesday, September 13th at 0700 hrs. following the Hurricane Irma closure.

Port of Miami – As of 8:00 p.m. Friday, September 8th the Port of Miami, Port Everglades, Miami River, Port of Palm Beach, Port of Ft. Pierce and remaining terminals and facilities within Section Miami's area of responsibility were closed.

Update September 13th – Port Everglades re-opened on Tuesday morning, September 12th.

Update September 11th - Port of Miami will open on Tuesday, September 12th. Marine terminals Pomtoc and SFCT may open Wednesday depending on final assessments.

Georgia Port Authority –

Update September 13th –

Garden City Terminal – Gate operations will resume normal business at 6am, Wednesday, September 13th. Effective 6am, September 13th all hazardous and reefer receiving will resume normal operations. Export Early Receiving will be managed closely. All 9 day windows will continue, but only 1 vessel in each service will be open for receiving at a time. This will be reviewed on Monday, Sept. 18th for changes. Empty Receiving and delivering will resume normal operations.

Terminal Free Time, Storage & Demurrage:

- Export Free Time will be extended for 4 days
- Import Dwell will be extended 4 days.
- Empty Storage will be determined at the end of September billing cycle
- Major Damage Free Time will be extended 3 days.
- Reefer Electricity charges will be extended 4 days.

Ocean Terminal – Gate Operations will resume normal business Wednesday, 0700 September 13, 2017. Vessel Operations will resume normal operations Wednesday, September 13, 2017.

Update September 13th – continued

Brunswick Terminal (Mayor's Point & Colonels Island)

No power at either location. Re-entry to Glynn County – State Patrol is controlling re-entry points and critical personnel access only at this time. Gate Operations will resume when officials provide re-entry.

Vessel Operations (RORO) may resume when access is allowed and power is restored.

GPA will post on its website at www.gaports.com any changes in the above actions as operations resume.

Update September 12th – GPA's critical workforce will be returning on Tuesday (9/12/17) morning to prepare the terminal for cargo operations. GPA will be working with their many logistics partners to determine reopening of the port and river channel. As of now, GPA expects truck gates to resume operation Wednesday morning.

Update September 7th – In response to Hurricane Irma, the Georgia Ports Authority will cease operations at the Ports of Savannah and Brunswick effective Saturday, September 9th through Tuesday, September 12.
