

## **Updates on Impacts of Hurricane Florence**

Below is information regarding UIIA Equipment Providers that have service areas impacted by Hurricane Florence. This list provides links to updates/advisories for specific UIIA Equipment Providers. New information will be added to this list as further updates are made available from UIIA Equipment Providers that have facilities in the impacted areas.

### **ACL /Grimaldi /Inarme – as of 9/21/18**

Virginia International Terminals (Portsmouth & Norfolk)  
Closed on September 12, 13 and 14

South Carolina Port Authority (North Charleston and Wando)  
Closed on September 13 and 14

ACL will be extending free time for the dates that the above facilities were closed.

### **Hyundai Merchant Marine – as of 9/21/18**

HMM has already granted additional days in regards to section 1 (Free Time and Use Charge) of its UIIA addendum for the preparedness of hurricane Florence and for the initial days terminals were closed. As of Tuesday September 18, 2018 HMM was advised that all terminals are back operational, however there were some side streets and locations that still had flood waters. HMM will work with motor carriers on a case by case situation to grant additional days if applicable due to hurricane Florence.

### **CMA-CGM (America) LLC – as of 9/21/18**

CMA-CGM will work with companies on a case-by-case basis in regards to granting extended free time in the impacted areas.

### **Hapag Lloyd – as of 9/28/18**

HL is following terminal lead for when terminal were closed will be considered a free day. Note, if the container was already incurring per diem prior to the closure then per diem will continue during closure. But still under free time, these will be considered additional free days:

**Seaboard Marine – Update on application of free time and per diem as of 9/20/18**

Seaboard Marine suspended the calculation of free time from Wednesday, September 12, 2018, for all intermodal and trucking operations to and from Virginia, North Carolina, or South Carolina. The Charlotte, North Carolina origin/destination hold on freight to/from Fort Lauderdale and Miami, FL was lifted on Tuesday, September 18, 2018. All motor operations to and from Virginia, North Carolina, or South Carolina resumed on Tuesday, September 18, 2018, but on a limited basis as a result of road closures and flood zones. Seaboard is working with customers in flooded areas where it is not able to reach their facilities on a case-by-case basis and will grant additional free days in these affected areas.
